

Fourth Grade Reading Learning Opportunities:

Let's keep those reading skills sharp! While we are out of school, please utilize the following as often as possible:

1. Lexia

From a computer or laptop:

- Online, go to: clever.com/in/woodbridge
- click, "log in with an active directory."
- To log in, each student must enter their school email address, which is as follows:
- firstname.lastname@students.wsd.k12.de.us
- Their password is their school lunch number.
- Once logged in, students will scroll to the bottom of the page where they will find a blue icon called "Lexia Core 5." Click on this icon and follow directions.

From a tablet:

- Download the Lexia Core 5 app. It is free.
- Once its downloaded, you will follow the steps to access your child's account. You will be prompted to enter your child's homeroom teacher's email address, which is teachersfirstname.lastname@wsd.k12.de.us. Your child will log in using their lunch number for BOTH their username and password, just as they do on readnquiz.

This program works just like edmentum does form math. There is an initial assessment set to determine a child's level, and lessons are individualized based on a student's instructional level.

2. Review and practice with PREVIOUSLY TAUGHT vocabulary words from Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. Use the "Word Work" Menu and select several of the activities for each word list.
3. Continue to read, read, read! Use books of your choosing to compete the Weekly Reading Log Bingo. When finished a book, log on and take a quiz at <https://readnquiz.com/home.aspx?id=12341> Students use their lunch number as their username and password to log into this program.
4. For any books that you read that are not available on readnquiz, or if you don't have access to the website, complete the attached book review.

Week 1: Vocabulary & Spelling Words

Ab · surd (*closed, r-controlled*) is an adjective that means completely untrue or unreasonable. Example: *If you said you saw a cow fly, I would say that was absurd.*

Sat · is · fy (*closed, closed, open*) is a verb that means either to do what you have agreed or to make happy. Example: *I have never been satisfied with my job.*

Stam · mer (*closed, r-controlled*) is a noun or verb. The verb means to speak with stops and repetition. The noun is the sound that the person makes. Example: *He always began to stammer when he was under pressure.*

As · ton · ish (*closed, closed, closed*) is a verb that means to strike with wonder or surprise. Example: *You astonished me with the quality of your writing.*

Nour · ish · ment (*vowel team, closed, closed*) is a noun that means food. Example: *You need healthy nourishment to stay strong.*

Mar · vel · ous (*r-controlled, closed, vowel team*) is an adjective that means causing wonder or having very high quality. Example: *I feel marvelous when I finish a great book.*

Be sure to tell the definition and then tell what your connection is. <p>EXAMPLE:</p> <p>Gigantic- extremely big</p> <p>Connection- Last summer, I went to a waterpark that had a gigantic slide.</p>

Week 2: Vocabulary & Spelling Words

Prec · ious (*closed, vowel team*) is an adjective that means worth a lot of money or greatly loved. Example: *You are precious to your family.*

Es · cort (*closed, r-controlled*) is a verb or a noun. The verb means to take someone someplace, so the noun means someone who takes someone someplace. Example: *When you are sick, we have a friend escort you to the nurse.*

Daw · dle (*vowel team, C-le*) is a verb that means to waste time or move slowly. Example: *If you don't want to go somewhere, you might dawdle.*

Pro · ceed · ing (*open, vowel team, closed*) can be a verb that means going forward, or a noun that means an event. It is related to the word *procedure*. Example: *I saw a parade proceeding down the main street of the town.*

Churn · ing (*r-controlled, closed*) is a verb or an adjective. *Churn* is a noun that means a type of machine that is used to make butter from cream by mixing it. The verb form means to mix. The word can be used literally or figuratively. Example: *My feelings were churning in my chest.*

In · sist (*closed, closed*) is a verb that means to demand something. Example: *I insist that you treat one another respectfully.*

Week 3: Vocabulary & Spelling Words

Ob · stin · ate · ly (*closed, closed, irregular, open*) is an adverb that means not willing to change your opinion or actions. Example: *Sometimes people act obstinately even when they know they are wrong.*

Waft (*closed*) is a verb that means to move lightly about, carried by a wind or wave. Example: *Smells wafts from the kitchen when someone is baking.*

In · cin · er · a · tor (*closed, closed, r-controlled, open, r-controlled*) is a noun that means a machine that burns garbage. Example: *Apartment buildings used to have incinerators.*

Pan · der (*closed, r-controlled*) is a verb that means to encourage the bad habits of someone else. Example: *If your friend is doing something that you know is wrong but you laugh, you are pandering.*

Gal · lant · ly (*closed, closed, open*) is an adverb that means polite and attentive. Example: *I like it when people act gallantly in the cafeteria by helping classmates.*

Prec · ip · ice (*closed, closed, closed*) is a noun that means a steep or high part of a mountain. Example: *If you climb to the precipice, you usually have a great view.*
